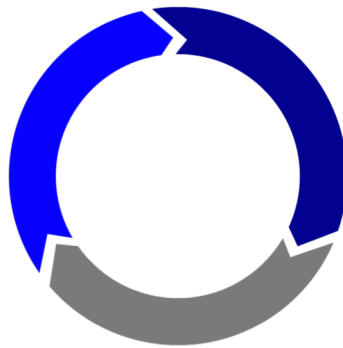


COACH

& DRAW OUT



TEACH
PUT INFORMATION IN

INSTRUCT
TEACH & CORRECT/DEMO

- 🛡 Teaching puts information into a student by telling.
- 🛡 Instructing involves teaching, as well as demonstrating and correcting.
- 🛡 Coaching draws out what a person knows by asking questions.

MODE	EXAMPLES
TEACHING	"It's important to look far ahead."
INSTRUCTING	"Look ahead." (while pointing to where the driver should be looking)
COACHING	"Where are you looking?"
TEACHING	"Your brake release should be made smoothly."
INSTRUCTING	"Smoothly release the brake pedal." (while demonstrating with your hand)
COACHING	"How smoothly are you releasing the brake pedal?"

One mode is no better than another. It's a matter of timing. [Vary your approach](#) to helping students learn. As a general guideline or rule: [Teach](#) Novices and [Coach](#) Advanced Drivers. But Coach – [ask questions](#) – as often as you can, as it draws out what the driver already knows, makes them think, and makes learning stick.

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
